CAMFT Educational Foundation Scholarship (\$4,000)

This scholarship is designed for individuals who are pursuing an advanced degree beyond the qualifying degree for an MFT license (post master's degree program) or are conducting a research project that will advance the profession of marriage and family therapy or participating in advanced training, education, or an unpaid internship within the field of marriage and family therapy.

Educational Foundation Scholarship Commemorating Ronald D. Lunceford (\$4,000)

This scholarship honors the memory and work of Ronald D. Lunceford by providing financial assistance to a person from an under-represented ethnic population for admission into an MA, MS, or PhD program which will qualify for licensure as a marriage and family therapist.

Educational Foundation Scholarship Commemorating Clinton E. Phillips (\$4,000)

This scholarship honors the memory and work of Clinton E. Phillips and is designed for individuals who are enrolled in an approved or accredited degree program leading to a qualifying degree for an MFT license; are licensed as a marriage and family therapist and are pursuing advanced training in an accredited or approved degree program; have demonstrated a high degree of academic achievement; have demonstrated financial need as established by the CAMFT Educational Foundation Scholarship Committee; participate actively in community and civic events; are committed to the profession of marriage and family therapy; are of high moral and ethical character.

CAMFT Educational Foundation Grant (Up to \$2,500)

This grant is designed for members of CAMFT who either individually or as a group need financial assistance to engage in a project or activity of benefit to the marriage and family therapy profession. Proposals should be made for research, programs, or projects of an educational nature which will enhance the knowledge, skills, and abilities of marriage and family therapists. Such programs, projects, or activities could include, but are not limited to, the following: A training event organized by a CAMFT chapter or group of CAMFT members; a collaborative event with a university and a group of clinicians; or a research project conducted by a group of CAMFT members.
